- Please send your child with a bagged lunch and a refillable bottle of water to every camp unless otherwise specified.
- Rease apply enough sunscreen before drop off as we are not allowed to reapply.
- Please be ON TIME, if you are late for drop off, your child will be left behind. For every 15 minutes you are late for pick up, there will be a \$5 dollar fine.

July 31


