FIELD TRIP TIME!

On Wednesday, October 18th, Wayne Rowland hosted the (ECA) Extension Association ladies as they started their day boarding a 15 passenger van for a field trip to the International Civil Rights Museum, Greensboro, NC, a place that was built around a memorable Civil Rights Movement site: the Woolworth department store lunch counter where four black men conducted a sit-in to protest the counter building off limits to Black customers. The museum covered the stages of the sit-in (origins, growth, counter protests, municipality and business response, when and how it ended) etc. Next on the agenda after lunch was a trip to A&T State University's Extension & Research Farm. The 492-acre farm features active livestock and horticultural production. The farm raises crops and livestock, including dairy and beef cattle, poultry, swine, horses, meat goats and sheep. The farm is used for research and education.


Notes From Our Horticulture Agent




Expanded Food & Nutrition Education (EFNEP)


The Incredible Years program is in our fifth week of fifteen sessions and we are having loads of fun with our parents. Currently, we are discussing the wondrous effects child-directed play has on children. We role-play scenarios and answer very specific questions during our time together.

One of the discussion points centered around what to do when your child has trouble disengaging from play.

The general rule is to establish expectations and routines that they can rely on. For example; before you start playing, inform them that playtime has a specific time limit. If you want to use the timer on your phone or a regular kitchen timer, you want to let them know that when your timer goes off it will be time to start cleaning up so they can move to the next thing.

Once the timer goes off they will recognize that it's time to stop and clean up (they will ignore this the first time). It may take a few sessions, but eventually, they will understand and won't have to be told what to do when the timer goes off. To have parenting success is easy if you understand how to set expectations and boundaries.
